





- A Web-Enhanced course also offers a space for augmenting course content. PowerPoint slides, readings, outside videos, and tutorials can all be housed on the LMS for students to access outside the F2F class time.
- This type of course also offers a centralized location for communication. You can easily communicate with students, and students can collaborate with peers without infringing on the limited amount of F2F time that you have available.

Finally, if you have a Web-Enhanced course in place, it makes switching to online instruction easier because students are already familiar with how you utilize the LMS. It also means that your course shell is in place and does not have to be created.
