Learning more about Canvas: How do I assign an assignment to an individual student? (differentiated assignment)



Have you ever wished that there was an easy way in Canvas to allow a student to have extra time on an assignment, or turn it in on a different date without having to create a new assignment for them? Well, there is an easy way! Give it a try.

- When creating or editing an assignment, the default is to assign an assignment to individual students.
- You can also set different due and availability dates for a student within an assignment that is assigned to the rest of the class.
- A single student, or a subgroup of students, can be added based on different due dates and availability settings.
- You can have multiple separate subsets of individuals or subgroups for a single assignment.
