TEACHING EFFECTIVELY IN A WORLD OF AI

The use of AI tools can help ease teacher workload. One way AI/ChatGPT can help instructors is by generating personalized, constructive feedback for students' work submissions. To use this feature as instructors, enter the parameters related to the learning outcome or rubric associated with the assignment, and select a sample of student work. Then, ask ChatGPT to analyze the work using the rubric and provide specific feedback including areas of strength and improvement.

Using AI tools in this way can save instructors time and enable them to provide more detailed and helpful feedback to their students

AUTHENTIC LEARNING MODULE IS NOW OPEN

On April 19, ITLE conducted a workshop called "Authentic Learning and

Assessment: A Response to AI" to discuss ethical academic practices. A module containing the workshop recording and resources discussed during the session is now available. By reviewing this talk, instructors can begin to consider incorporating a student-centered approach to their teaching and course design.
