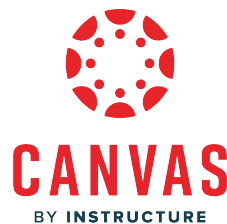

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## Improving Student Academic Progress: Messaging Students About Individual Assignments

It can be challenging to influence students' academic progress in a course. Early and consistent communication is important. Wouldn't it be nice to be able to message students about how they did on an assignment based on grade ranges? Well, you can. Check it out!



- Message all students who haven't submitted yet.
- Message all students who haven't been graded yet.
- Message all students who scored LESS than [point value].
- Message all students who scored MORE than [point value].
- Despite sending a single message based on all students in the grade range, each student receives an individual message without a list of who else the message went to.
- You can also message students based on an assignment group or the Total column.
