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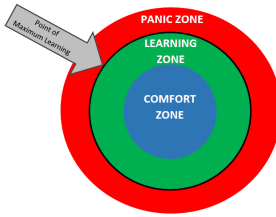

Have you ever wanted to automate a reminder to your students of an upcoming deadline without having to create the announcement the week of the assessment or event? This is actually very easy to do by creating announcements in advance and setting a date and time for the announcement to post. If the date needs to change, announcements are very easy to edit at any time. Give it a try and see what you think!



- Automate reminders for students of key events, opportunities and deadlines.
- Create the reminder of an assignment deadline as soon as you create the assignment.
- Communicate any media events or opportunities like guest lectures, etc. prior to the date.
