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Setting the Tone on the First Day

Learning students' names creates a welcoming classroom environment, but can be challenging in large classes. Here are some strategies to help make the process easier.



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When students feel a sense of social belonging in an atmosphere that projects kindness and respect, they are more motivated and engaged. Use these one-page assignments at the beginning of the semester to help build classroom community.

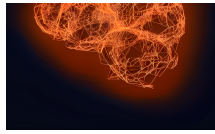
