Learning More About Canvas: How do I Create and Assign an Assignment to a Course Group? (Group Assignment)

Have you ever wanted to use group assignments but were concerned about how to manage this in Canvas? Well, Canvas allows an instructor to create groups within a course that function as a course within a course with seamless connection to the gradebook. Teachers always have access to any groups in their course. Check it out!



- Groups are essentially a course within a course that can be set up as a place for students to collaborate, or as a basis for group-based assignments.
- The basis for groups is the GROUP SET — this is the general topic, or assignment name, for developing a group-based assignment or collaboration.
- Within the group set the teacher creates multiple groups of students from the class that can create or be assigned different sub-topics to explore. Each group has access to Canvas collaboration tools and their own space to interact as a group.
- The group set should be created first, then an assignment is created using the Group Assignment checkbox in Assignments. The group set is then attached to that assignment.
