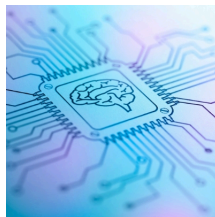

Canvas Requests for Summer & Fall 2024: Combining Course Sections (Cross-Listing/Merging)

Course sections within Canvas for summer and fall 2024 can be combined upon request. The sooner this is done, the better to avoid traffic jams at the beginning of the next semester. To request a combination of two or more course sections, email



canvas@okstate.edu with the names of the courses as they currently appear in Canvas including the five-digit CRN code.

Example:

- Combining Courses (cross-listing/merging) allows you to

merge sections and merge forms into individual courses and

move section enrollments from individual courses and combine them into one course. This feature is helpful for instructors who teach several sections of the same course and only want to manage course data in one location.

- When courses are combined, the new course with the content receives the enrollments, but not the materials or grades, from each of the courses merged into it. These merged courses become sections within the new course.
- Graduate (5000+ courses) can only be combined with other graduate courses, or senior level undergraduate level (4000+ courses) or above, with the same content.

Combining Courses (cross-listing) should only be completed while courses are unpublished. If a published course's enrollment is moved into a new course, the merged sections will lose any associated assignment submissions and grades, because **ONLY** enrollments of the combined courses are moved into the new course.



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
