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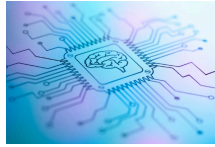
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2024 Teaching with Technology Conference – Last Chance!

Learning More About Canvas: Using Canvas Commons

Have you wondered while designing or revising a course if there weren't existing Canvas quizzes, or pages or even modules that you could access and edit, rather than designing everything from scratch? Or, perhaps, you simply want to see what a complete course in your subject might look like. What you are describing is an easily accessed tool in Canvas called Canvas Commons. This tool is designed for Canvas users from around the country to securely share Canvas materials. Canvas Commons can be very useful for easily accessing anything from a quiz or assignment all the way to a complete course. Check it out!



- Canvas Commons is accessed with a link on your blue Canvas account menu. It looks like: Cà. Canvas Commons is a means of sharing course content with other people or institutions. OK State does not let you share your courses with other institutions, but you can share them with other OSU faculty. You can also import existing materials into your course shells from OSU, or from other institutions.
- Once in Commons use the Search feature to search for types of content (e.g., Spanish). You can also add more specific language (Spanish vocabulary). Use the filter to specify the grade level (Undergraduate) and type (pages, module, quiz, etc.). You can select multiple types. Use Import/Download to save content into one of your courses or download it to your computer for later review.
- Another use of Canvas Commons is to quickly save your own courses or course materials. If you have a Canvas account, you can store and re-access your course materials in Commons, without giving anyone else access, simply

select “Only Me” under Sharing and License. Most of your content has a link on the 3-dot menu to easily “share to commons” You can re-import these stored materials or classes into a Canvas course shell whenever you wish.
