



Self-Paced Online Teaching Workshop

This self-paced online teaching workshop covers a variety of topics such as outcomeoriented course design, engaging online learners, creating an online activity and assessment plan, and more. While working through modules in the orkshop, participants will create an Online Learning Assessment Portfolio which will be submitted to the instructor upon completion of the final Module. Content can be imported into a Canvas directly from other Canvas courses, which is very useful when re-using content from one semester to another. The same process can be used when copying content from a Sandbox or Test environment into an actual course...

More Canvas Tips

Live-Streaming from the Classroom

With the installation of Huddle / Avaya and Owl cameras in general usage classrooms across campus, it is possible to livestream classroom instruction. This will help in dedensifying classrooms and provide a means for students to keep up with their studies they are not able to attend in person.

There are two supported live-streaming technologies on campus, Microsoft Teams, which

is part of Office 365 suite, and *Conferences* in Canvas. The exact process for live-streaming from the classroom will depend on which streaming technology (Teams or Conferences) an instructor chooses and which type of camera (Huddle / Avaya or Owl) is in the classroom. The videos below walk through how to live-stream using each possible combination.

Engage Your Students using a Response System System

iClicker has been adopted as the campus-wide student response system. Students can use iClicker through an app on their Smart phone/tablet or by purchasing a remote device. Whether students are in the same classroom or in another location, faculty can use iClicker app to take attendance, check student comprehension and engagement during instruction, and assess learning through adhoc or scheduled short quizzes. Faculty who are using a

MacMillan textbook can bundle the iClicker app for just \$5.00. Training to use iClicker will be available in August. Contact itle@okstate.edu if you have questions about iClicker.
