# 1. iCLICKER STUDENT RESPONSE SYSTEM TRAINING

May 13, 2:00 to 3:00 p.m. Online

An online training on using the iClicker student response system with a course in Canvas will be held May 13. Topics include connecting iClicker Cloud to the course roster in Canvas, using the geo-fencing function for attendance to ensure students are physically in class, using iClicker for polling and low-stakes quizzing and transferring grades to a Canvas grade book.

As you are planning your summer and fall 2021 book orders and are considering adopting a student response system, please be aware that iClicker was selected as the campus

student response system in spring 2020. iClicker can be used to take attendance, check for student understanding during instruction and assess student learning after instruction. iClicker has both a physical clicker and an app (iClicker Reef) that can be used with a smart device (smart phone, tablet, laptop). Our institutional contract reduces the cost to students significantly; students using the iClicker Reef app on a smart device will pay only \$3 a semester to use in as many courses as needed. Students who use the iClicker device will pay significantly more, so we would urge you to allow students to use their mobile devices with the Reef app in your classes.

With the institutional license, students will be able to set up the iClicker Reef app without a link or code and their Bursar accounts will be billed after the second week of the semester.
