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1. (RE)ENGAGING STUDENTS FOR SUCCESSFUL LEARNING

Teaching during the Covid-19 pandemic was challenging for everyone. It was also an incredibly difficult time for our students. Many high schools throughout the state and nation remained closed for long periods of time. Students were forced to receive their learning materials virtually – and at times with very little support. Unfortunately, higher education experienced similar difficulties. Now, as we return to a fall semester of in-person teaching, the question around "student learning loss" looms. Are students ready for your class? Did they learn what they needed to last semester to find success in your course? A recent K-12 study predicted that, due to the pandemic, students might experience learning losses of up to 50% (TNTP, 2020). With this in mind, how can we help our students make up that ground and be successful in our classrooms this fall? What role will we play in helping students "catch up" on their missed learning? We believe it will be critical to provide some support for students as we continue to wade through these uncharted waters and unprecedented times.

2. WHAT DO YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT HB 1775?

In April 2021, HB 1775 was passed by the Oklahoma legislature and signed by Governor Stitt. This legislation, which came into effect July 1, 2021, prohibits higher education institutions from mandating that students complete any form of gender or sexual diversity training, orientation, or counseling; and includes any orientation or requirement based on race or sex stereotypes or biases. As a result, OSU no longer requires students to complete an annual diversity training. This law does not affect specific course content or academic freedom. Faculty can continue to teach content that is important to their disciplines, including content that may relate to diversity, gender and bias. As always, faculty should be sensitive to the emotional and mental health of their students when engaging in difficult topics.
