2. WHAT DO YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT HB 1775?

In April 2021, HB 1775 was passed by the Oklahoma legislature and signed by Governor Stitt. This legislation, which came into effect July 1, 2021, prohibits higher education institutions from mandating students complete any form of gender or sexual diversity training, orientation, or counseling; and includes any orientation or requirement based on race or sex stereotypes or biases. As a result, OSU no longer requires students to complete an annual diversity training. This law does not affect specific course content or academic freedom. Faculty can continue to teach content that is important to their disciplines, including content that may relate to diversity, gender and bias, as long as it is not taught in a biased manner or in a manner that stereotypes based on race or sex. As always, faculty should be sensitive to the emotional and mental health of their students when engaging in difficult topics. 
