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1. ONLINE AND HYBRID TEACHING RESOURCES

Teaching online or HyFlex, when thoughtfully planned, can be very engaging and effective across subjects and disciplines. Whether the content is taught synchronously (live) or asynchronously (on your own time), faculty can present information to students, demonstrate processes, facilitate large or small group discussions, assess student learning and provide feedback on assignments and assessments. ITLE has resources to assist you in your planning for a short-term shift or a semester-long course.

2. ASSISTING FACULTY INSTRUCTORS WHO TEACH D/DEAF STUDENTS WEBINAR

Our interest in this specific presentation is in helping faculty understand the needs of D/deaf people and hard of hearing people on campus as well as the interpreters that serve them. It is a pressing need. Faculty and grad students are sometimes painfully undereducated on ways to serve D/deaf students and the preparation work necessary to ensure

an equitable environment in the classroom and elsewhere on campus (an ADA requirement, even though many D/deaf students don't regard themselves as having a disability). We live in a "phono centric" campus and culture and those of us in the dominant hearing majority rarely think about it at all.

This webinar will provide information, resources, and best practices for instructors when teaching D/deaf students.
