3. ENGAGING INSTRUCTIONAL STRATEGIES: Overview of the

Discussion Strategy

"Discussion is a productive exchange of viewpoints, a collective exploration of uses involving higher-order thinking" (Nilson, 2016, p. 155). The discussion strategy is effective for optimizing student engagement and success in the learning environment regardless of the intended outcome. Engaging students in meaningful discussions takes sufficient skill on the part of the instructor. When using the discussion strategy, instructors should think of themselves more as a *facilitator* rather than a *provider of knowledge*. Using the discussion strategy requires the instructor to relinquish some control of the learning by empowering the students.

The Canvas gradebook is created dynamically as various graded items (quizzes, assignments, discussions, etc.) are created elsewhere in a course.

Weighted grades in Canvas can be used to assign grades based on how much percentage points a grade category is worth.

Grading an assignment in Canvas can be as simple as navigating through cells in an Excel spreadsheet.

Detailed information can also be added to a given grade, including Status (Late, Missing, Excused) and grade comments.Frequent low-stakes quizzes and

assignments are one way to check that students are keeping current with online course materials.

5. ONLINE AND HYBRID TEACHING RESOURCES

Teaching online or HyFlex, when thoughtfully planned, can be very engaging and effective across subjects and disciplines. Whether the content is taught synchronously (live) or asynchronously (on your own time), faculty members can present information to students, demonstrate processes, facilitate large or small group discussions, assess student learning and provide feedback on assignments and assessments. ITLE has resources to assist you in your planning for a short-term shift or a semester-long course.

Self-Paced Online Teaching Workshop

This self-paced online teaching workshop covers a variety of topics such as outcomeoriented course design, engaging online learners, creating an online activity and assessment plan and more. Whether you are new to online teaching or need a refresher, this course is designed to meet your needs in a flexible format. While working through modules in the workshop, participants will create an Online Learning Assessment Portfolio, which will be submitted to the instructor upon completion of the final module. After receiving your portfolio, the instructor will set up a time to discuss your experience in the workshop with a one-on-one video conference.
