

1. ITLE ANNUAL TEACHING WITH TECHNOLOGY CONFERENCE

Conference Details

2. CAMPUS ZOOM LICENSE FY2022-23

Beginning in Fiscal Year 2022-23, OSU will adopt a campus-wide license for the Zoom web conferencing software to be used with Canvas. With the adoption of Zoom, Big Blue Button (previously called Conferences in Canvas) will no longer be supported. Any faculty who has video recordings in Big Blue Button that they want to keep can save a copy of those recordings to a laptop or desktop hard drive.

To save Big Blue Button recordings: open the recording online, right-click on the video, and select "Save video as..." or "Save as..." depending on your browser.

All recordings should be saved by the extended deadline: June 24th.

Once saved, these files can be shared in future courses by uploading them in Canvas Studio and either placing a link in a course module or embedding the video in an announcement. That process with Studio is covered in this <u>PDF</u>.



3. EMBEDDING STUDIO VIDEOS IN CANVAS

Videos stored within Studio can be shared with students by either adding a link within the Modules or by embedding it within Pages in a Canvas course..

Embedding Studio Videos into a Canvas Module Watch the Video

Videos from Studio can be placed into Modules in Canvas which allows students to access them easily right alongside other course content.

Embedding Studio Videos into a Canvas Page Watch the Video

Videos from Studio can be placed into Modules in Canvas which allows students to access them easily right alongside other course content. Instructors can also add other content on a Canvas Page such as instructions and links that go along with the video. This is a revised tutorial to cover updates to the Canvas text editor interface.

Uploading Videos to Studio Watch the Video You can upload a video from your computer to Studio with a simple drag-and-drop action. Once uploaded, ITLE recommends adding tags to aid in searching for the video in the future.

4. COMBINE COURSE SECTIONS IN CANVAS

Course sections within Canvas for Summer & Fall 2021 can be combined upon request. To request a combination of two or more course sections, email <u>canvas@okstate.edu</u> with the names of the courses as they currently appear in Canvas including the five-digit CRN code.

Example:

Please combine the courses below.

ABCD-1234-12345 ABCD-1234-12346

Please be aware that only the materials, submissions, etc. from one section can be preserved during the combining process. Because of this, it is not recommended to combine sections once a semester has begun.

5. ONLINE AND HYBRID TEACHING RESOURCES

Teaching online or HyFlex, when thoughtfully planned, can be very engaging and effective across subjects and disciplines.
