

#### 2. INCLUSIVE STEM TEACHING PROJECT

The <u>Inclusive STEM Teaching Project</u>, a NSF Improving Undergraduate STEM Education program, is hosting two concurrent opportunities from **October 3 to November 22**, **2022**: a Massive Open Online Course (MOOC) and a virtual learning community.

The **six-week MOOC** is designed to advance the awareness, self-efficacy, and ability of STEM faculty, postdocs, graduate students, and staff to cultivate inclusive learning environments for their students. You can learn more and register for the course <a href="here">here</a>.

The "local" OSU virtual learning community will be facilitated by Donald French. Edward E. Bartlett Professor of Pedagogy in Integrative Biology. This learning community will meet Wednesdays starting October 12 at either 3:00, 3:30 or 4:00 PM during the ISTP eDX course and will extend the <a href="mailto:asynchronous">asynchronous</a> online activities within edX through <a href="mailto:synchronous">synchronous</a> virtual learning discussions and activities that we as a community can tailor to our context. <a href="mailto:Registrations">Registrations</a> completed by <a href="mailto:Monday October 3">Monday October 3</a> will have priority.

# 4. WORKING WITH NEW QUIZZES IN CANVAS

Canvas provides two different quiz engines for conducting online quizzes, New and Classic. Below are a series of videos that cover the basics of using the New quiz engine, which provides new question types and extended moderating options. The Classic quiz engine, used since OSU adopted Canvas, will remain in place until Spring 2024.

#### Overview of the New Quizzes Tool

The New Quizzes option in Canvas lets you create assessments that are more interactive and visual than traditional Quizzes. This video shows you how to select the New Quizzes option, and how to decide which version of Quizzes (Classic or New) is right for you


