

1. CLASSROOM ASSESSMENT: THE MINUTE PAPER

A Classroom Assessment Technique is a specific procedure or activity designed to help instructors gather useful data regarding student learning, and there are a wealth of classroom assessments that one could choose to utilize in a course.

This week we feature the **Minute Paper**. The Minute Paper is perhaps the most commonly used Classroom Assessment Technique. Sometimes referred to as the "One-Minute Paper" or the "Half Sheet Response" — the Minute Paper is a quick and easy way to collect written feedback on student learning.

2. IMPROVING INTERCULTURAL COMMUNICATION WITH GUEST SPEAKER DR. OKIM KANG

Dr. Kang addresses U.S. undergraduate students' biases in their judgments of international teaching assistants (ITAs)' speech in the face of growing diversity in the academy and introduces specific inter-group contact exercises as a tool for mitigating undergraduates' attitudes toward international instructors. The presenter will share various episodes in which U.S. undergraduates interact with ITAs in verbally rich situations.



Future applications of intercultural communication activities that promise to improve U.S. undergraduates' comprehension of ITAs' English will be discussed and concrete recommendations will be made for the development of their global citizenship.

3. ONLINE AND HYBRID TEACHING RESOURCES

Teaching online or HyFlex, when thoughtfully planned, can be very engaging and effective across subjects and disciplines. Whether the content is taught synchronously (live) or asynchronously (on your own time), faculty members can present information to students, demonstrate processes, facilitate large or small group discussions, assess student learning and provide feedback on assignments and assessments. ITLE has resources to assist you in your planning for a short-term shift or a semester-long course.

4. PLAGIARISM DETECTION IN CANVAS

The Turnitin plagiarism detection service is integrated into OSU's Canvas instance. Turnitin can analyze a file and determine which portion and how much of a file's contents match with known articles, papers, and websites within its expansive repository. Any file uploaded to an assignment within Canvas can be set to run through the service, either automatically or at the instructor's discretion. Turnitin provides a useful tool for instructing students about plagiarism, allowing draft copies of papers to be checked, or in detecting potential



academic integrity violations.

Using Turnitin for Plagiarism Detection

The Turnitin software can be used when setting up or modifying an assignment such that student submissions are automatically checked for academic integrity violations.

Advanced Options in Turnitin

The Turnitin plagiarism checking software has several userconfigurable options such as the ability to exclude certain sources, opting to include student submissions in the Turnitin database, and grammar-checking preferences.
