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1. EFFECTIVE EXAM REVIEW

Faculty often wonder if it's worth the extra time to conduct exam review sessions.

Sometimes it seems like a lot of extra work for few perceived benefits. As instructors, we

also don't want to feel as if we—instead of the students—are doing all the work. It should be up to the students to do the heavy lifting of figuring out what and how much to study—right? Yet, before exam time we often hear the words, "What's going to be on the test?"

3. SETTING UP EXTRA CREDIT IN CANVAS

Providing extra credit is not obvious in Canvas, but is entirely possibly with a few simple techniques. The exact process of providing extra credit differs slightly depending on whether your course is using the default point value approach or a weighted grade book. Both options are covered in the two videos below.

Extra Credit Assignments

Instructors can have Extra Credit options in a gradebook by creating assignments with a Zero point value, and then entering points for students who complete the assignment. These points are then added on top of points already accrued in class.

Extra Credit with Weighted Assignments

Extra Credit is possible when working with a weighted-style gradebook, but requires a few extra steps that have to do with assigning a 0 percentage weight to an Extra Credit category, and then knowing when to raise that percentage at the end of the semester.
